The following form is designed to evaluate your request for a donation from the Peninsula Rotary club. Here are a few guidelines for you to consider in your request. Rotary is an international service club that has at its heart the object of service above self. It is Rotary's desire to partner with people and communities for the advancing of world understanding and peace. Every Rotarian is asked to evaluate their life on the basis of what is called the 4-Way Test. It asks these questions: Is it the truth? Is it fair to all concerned? Will it build goodwill and better friendships? Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Any requests for funds will be looked at with these principles in mind. You should know that the Peninsula Rotary wants to be involved in projects that fit within the Rotary values of world peace, health, hunger eradication, humanitarian aims, and literacy/education. It is not our desire to stand in judgment on the legitimacy of your project, but funds are limited and needs can seem to be unlimited. That is why it is necessary to ask the following questions:

- Is there a person or an organization already doing what you wish to do?
- Is this for the benefit of a single person or does it represent a community need?
- Are you willing to come and present your project to the Rotary club?
- If funds are granted will you come and report on the outcome to the Rotary Club?
- Have you spoken with the necessary agencies/organizations that would benefit or be affected by your project? (i.e., schools, hospitals, Senior centers, and etc.)

Consider the preceding questions in light of your request. These are the things that Rotary will be looking at in evaluating your request.
